- Recognize risks and disorders of infancy/early childhood to make appropriate referrals.
- Share an understanding of relationship development with families, caregivers, and other professionals.
- Help parents, caregivers, and other professionals recognize practices that scaffold the healthy social-emotional development of infants and toddlers.
- Assist families in anticipating, obtaining, and advocating for their needs.
